

Seder without a Passover or Seder with a Passover?

This year will you have just another Seder without a Passover?

If you want, you can have a Seder with a Passover.

EXODUS 12:13 *“And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye are: and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt.”*

I found out Seder and Passover were not the same.

Raised in a Jewish home and the grandson of an Orthodox Rabbi I loved the Seder every year until I found out that a Seder and Passover were not the same. I knew the word Seder means order and that sure describes all the preparation and order of the ceremony. But, then I learned from Exodus 12:13 that the meaning of Passover is what the angel of death did – the angel of death Passed Over or Skipped some of the houses.

But, it did not skip all the houses. Just because a house was a Jewish house was no guarantee that the angel of death would pass over that house. The angel of death skipped only the houses that had the blood on the door posts. It did not matter if a house was a Jewish house or an Egyptian house ⇒ no blood no Pass Over. God said that when He saw the blood He would pass over that house. It did not matter if the house was a Jewish house or an Egyptian house ⇒ if there was blood on the doorposts that house would be Passed Over.

Where is the blood?

And not just any blood, but the blood of a lamb without blemish. This blood was the most important part of the Passover. No blood no Passover.

I started to ask, “If this year I am going to have a true Passover then where is the blood?” “Where is the blood that God would see and pass over me?” God said, “When I see the blood I will pass over you.” So I asked, “Where is the blood God would see for me to make me like a house of life instead of a house of death?” There could be no blood without a lamb.

I felt like Isaac walking with Abraham his father when Isaac said to his father in Genesis 22:7 *“And Isaac spake unto Abraham his father, and said, My father: and he said, Here am I, my son. And he said, Behold the fire and the wood: but where is the lamb for a burnt offering?”*

Where is the lamb?

Isaac saw the Seder of the fire and the wood and he knew the most important part was missing and he asked, “Where is the lamb?” I would look at the Seder of the table and all the parts in order and the Haggadah and like Isaac I would ask, “Where is the lamb?”

Searching for the lamb led me to read in the New Testament what John the Baptizer said when he saw the Lord Jesus Christ coming to him in John 1:29 *“Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.”* In the Lord Jesus Christ I found my Passover Lamb that took my sin away. From then on I no longer had just the Seder, but I now had the Passover.
